Review of accounting books, records and minutes of proceedings

Dear Mr. Bleichner:

I am in receipt of your letter dated May 5, 2009 reiterating the same babble incorporated in your letter of April 24, 2009. As outlined in my letter of April 1, 2009 I requested access to certain documents to review them. (Attached) Your most recent letter indicated that under California law I have a right as a member to review the financial documents, thus I would like to know when they will be made available for my review.

Your implication that an audit was to be conducted in without any merit. At no time did I request that I wished to "audit" the records as I am not a licensed CPA in the State of California. Furthermore if you conduct research on case law you will find that the two terms are used interchangeably quite often by lawyers unknowledgeable in accounting practices.

Since your client has unequivocally denied me rights under both California and Federal Law I will have no alternative to request governmental intervention to enforce my rights.

Additionally, your most recent letter has omitted all operational and financial information I requested applicable to CALI-PAC. Please be advised that at this point I

will assume it was simply an oversight on your part and that you will be supplying that information forthwith.
